July 13, 2007 Update from EnTech, Linden Project Engineers

- Hot Iron installed sanitary sewer this week in the alley south of Burkitt between Jefferson and Linden. The approximately 60 feet of main remaining will be installed the first of next week.
- Gravel base course material was installed this week along Griffith Avenue between Works and Burkitt. Once this work is completed, traffic to and from Sherman will be rerouted to the west in lieu of east along Burkitt. This rerouting will allow storm sewer and water main installation to continue east of Sherman along Burkitt.
- Hot Iron will commence next week with water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer installation along Jefferson between Burkitt and Whitney.
- Last week's violent thunderstorm accentuated the need for the storm sewer project. Manhole covers were lifted from the undersized storm sewer in Linden, and water from Cemetery Draw overflowed into the Sherman-Harrison intersection, where it flowed north to the Sherman-Burkitt intersection and into the new, larger storm sewer. Many large, older trees were also blown over, reminding everyone that these older trees – while beautiful – are susceptible to weather damage and resulting damage to houses and vehicles.



Please be cautious as construction activity continues and traffic control varies as the project progresses. This includes keeping children away from construction activity or open trenches at all times.
