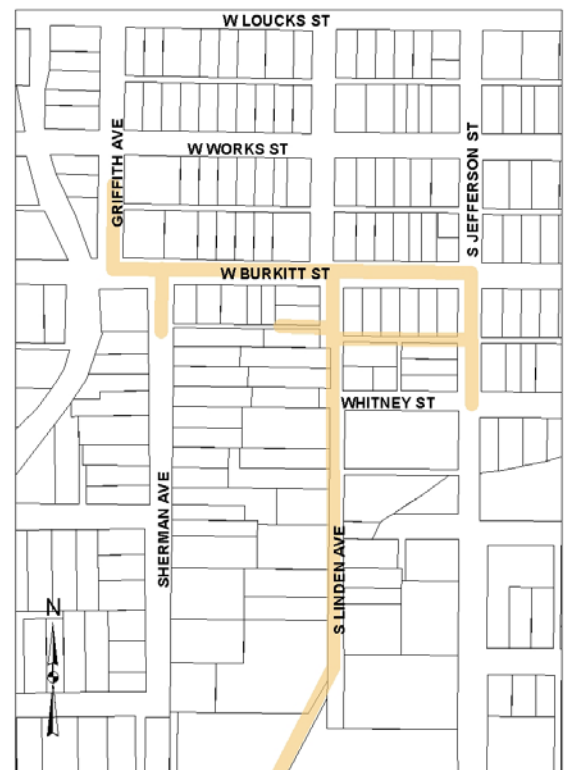
Memo from Mayor Kinskey and Ward 2 Council members Marc Ketcham and Tom O'Leary:

### July 27, 2007 Update from EnTech, Linden Project Engineers

- Hot Iron completed installation of all water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer lines this week in Jefferson between Burkitt and Whitney. This street will now receive gravel base course to bring it up close to finish grade. Curb, gutter and sidewalk will follow in the next three weeks.
- Hot Iron began installation of water mains and services in Burkitt between Sherman and Linden. Installation will continue east to Jefferson. Close behind on Burkitt will be the storm sewer, which has been somewhat delayed pending delivery of a crane to set the large Stormceptor structure. The Stormceptor will be installed just east of the Burkitt-Sherman intersection.
- Residents are reminded that the Child Development Center parking lot is not to be used as an access route for Linden. The CDC folks have graciously agreed to work with us when construction begins on Linden, but not until that time.



Please be cautious as construction activity continues and traffic control varies as the project progresses. This includes keeping children away from construction activity or open trenches at all times.
