Memo from Mayor Kinskey and Ward 2 Council member Marc Ketcham:

Communication is vital on a project like this – especially because it affects your neighborhood. We have asked the engineers on the project to keep open lines of communication with you:

August 17, 2007 Update from EnTech, Linden Project Engineers

- Hot Iron has virtually completed all water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer installation required for the project on all streets except Linden Avenue. Gravel base course is being placed on all streets disturbed to date in anticipation of the concrete curb, gutter and sidewalk subcontractor, slated to begin work on Monday, August 20th.
- At this time, it is anticipated that asphalt paving will commence during the week after Labor Day.
- Once Burkitt, Jefferson, Sherman and Griffith are paved, work can begin on Linden Avenue. Water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer mains are also scheduled for replacement and upgrade on that street.
- Residents are reminded that the Child Development Center parking lot is not to be used as an access route for Linden. The CDC folks have graciously agreed to work with us when construction begins on Linden, but not until that time.
- Please be aware of the changing traffic signage that is continually being altered as the project progresses.



The project scope includes replacement of individual water and sewer service lines from the new mains to a point at or near the property line, at no cost to the property owner. The City, however, will not be replacing service lines from the property line to the building, as they are private lines. If you are concerned about the condition of your water and sewer service lines, you may discuss replacing those lines with a representative of Hot Iron while they are in the area, or contact your own plumber to perform this work while the construction on the City utility systems is occurring.
