September 21, 2007 Update from EnTech, Linden Project Engineers

- Asphalt paving has now been completed on Burkitt, Jefferson, Griffith and Sherman. Some concrete driveway and sidewalk installation remains in these areas, thus there may be some minor, temporary restrictions while this concrete construction takes place. Topsoil and resodding will also be performed in disturbed areas. Thanks to everyone living on or near these streets for your patience during this period of construction.
- Hot Iron has begun asphalt street removal along Linden to allow commencement of utility upgrades in Linden Avenue. Utility construction will begin the week of September 24th.
- Qwest and Bresnan are nearing completion of their relocation of aboveground wires in Linden underground in anticipation of Hot Iron’s work. MDU will also be moving some of their power poles.
- Hot Iron has completed installation of the upper (southerly) section of the Linden storm sewer.



- The Child Development Center parking lot is not to be used as an access route for Linden until Hot Iron begins construction on Linden south of Linden. The CDC folks have graciously agreed to work with us when construction begins on Linden, but not until that time.
- Please be aware of the changing traffic signage that is continually being altered as the project progresses.
