December 7, 2007 Update from EnTech, Linden Project Engineers

- Hot Iron continues to install concrete sidewalk, driveways and approaches as the weather allows. It is at this time uncertain when actual installation will cease for the winter, but it is likely that once the weather turns permanently cold, there will be no further work until spring. At that time, those driveway approaches that have not been installed will have gravel placed on them to allow for property owners to drive over the newly-placed curb.
- Those residing along Linden that are now parking on the street are again requested to move their vehicles each weekday morning until construction ceases for the winter. In this way, Hot Iron will be able access the curbside for placement of driveway approaches and sidewalks.
- Hot Iron continues with construction of the inlet structure at the mouth of Cemetery Draw. The concrete floor was placed this week, and forms are currently being erected to construct the sidewalls. This structure will direct stormwater flowing down the draw into the large storm sewer that has been installed in Linden and Burkitt.
- Residents are cautioned about walking on insulating blankets that have been placed over the newly-placed concrete to keep it from freezing. These blankets can be slippery if snow has fallen on them. Take care when crossing over them, or find another route if possible.
