

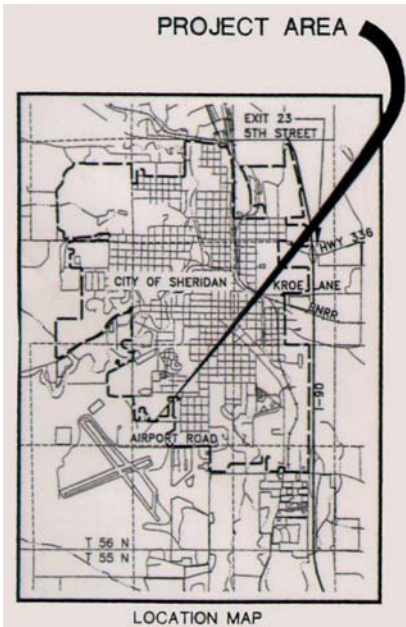

## OLYMPUS DRIVE AND DE SMET AVENUE RECONSTRUCTION PROJECT



### August 4, 2005 Discussion Items:

#### 1. Schedule:

- Waterline installation is continuing on Kona Pl and Kailua Pl. All new waterlines are complete in De Smet Av and services are connected to new line. Testing of the new waterline in Kailua Pl may begin today. This line may be available to be put into service by August 8. Water service will be off for several hours when the new line is tied into the system. The new waterline in Kona Pl will be complete and ready for service by August 12.
- Parking and access to Kona Pl and Kailua Pl will be interrupted for approximately one more week for waterline work. Residents may want to leave vehicles outside of the cul-de-sac during construction hours.
- Rotomilling is complete on De Smet Av, Kona Pl and Kailua Pl. Preparation for paving has started.
- Rotomilling has started on Cedar Av and will continue onto Olympus Dr next week.
- Concrete removal has started on Olympus Dr. Some water service line curb stops are in the concrete driveways, so those driveways will be removed back to the existing curb stop.
- Concrete replacement is continuing on De Smet Av.
- ICM requested a road closure at the intersection of De Smet Av and Absaraka St for Monday August 8 and Tuesday August 9. This will allow them to get the base material placed in preparation for paving. They may need to close the same intersection when paving starts. Paving will start August 15.

#### 2. Other:

- Make sure all water service areas have orange barricade fences in place each night before workers leave the site.
- Dust control on weekends will be one pass, around noon, on non-paved roads each day with a water truck. During these hot days, dust control is required during working hours also.
- A request has been made to the school bus supervisor about the possibility of not bringing a school bus through Olympus Dr during construction. If proper notification is presented to the homeowners, he indicated that this may be possible. Discussion on this item will continue.

#### 3. Information from the City.

The project scope includes replacement of individual service lines from the new main to the curb stop at or near the property line, at no cost to the consumer. The City will not be replacing service lines from the curb stop to the building as they are private lines. However, if you are concerned about the condition of your service line, you may discuss replacing that line with the Contractor while he is in the area. Keep in mind that this is a business agreement between you and the Contractor. The City will not be involved. We are not opposed to the Contractor taking on the extra work so long as he is able to meet the requirements of the contract documents for the City's project.

#### New Service Line Installations

Property owners who have not received water service prior to this project, and would like a new service line run to their property, are required to fill-out an application with the City of Sheridan and pay the appropriate plant investment fees and connection charges (tap, meter, etc.). Please contact Mike Peacock of the City of Sheridan at 674-6483 to obtain an application if you would like to establish a new water service.
